

News of the courses supported by TWC UPDATE ON THE TRAINING AT ADAPT, MUMBAI be on-going travel restrictions due to Covid prevented UPDATE ON THE MIDDLE EAST DISABILITY/INCLUSION (CBID) TRAINING PROGRAMME

The on-going travel restrictions due to Covid prevented ADAPT holding the Annual 14 week Community Initiatives in Inclusion Course (CII) in Mumbai in 2022. Instead TWC funded 2 on-line 6 week courses, "Inclusion Matters", developed by ADAPT. These Courses were well attended and the Evaluations were very positive. In addition, ADAPT developed an on-line course for parents and carers. A major Evaluation on the impact of the CII course is taking place and will be available to TWC shortly. ADAPT has been involved in further development of the 6 Hubs during 2022 and a series of Training sessions on Disability and Inclusion are planned for 2023 with a number of them.

Finally, TWC was involved in the Golden Jubilee Celebration for ADAPT in Mumbai in October 2022.

The Women's Council would like to wish ADAPT heartfelt congratulations on celebrating 50 Years of exemplary work in the field of disability and inclusion. (Dr Moore) Due to a combination of continued unrest in the Middle East and the on-going Covid pandemic restrictions, it was not possible to hold the planned Pan/Arab Training in Jordan in November. Our partners SETI and Dr Alaa Sebeh at UNESCWA are working with the Al Hussein Foundation in Amman, Jordan to hold this 2 week course for Managers and Planners of CBID programmes in the Middle East in 2023. The recent earthquake in South East Turkey has highlighted the need for the addition of CBID planning in emergencies which will be included in the Training

The Journey of a CII participant from Nepal, Prakriti Bhattarai

A TRIUMPH OF WILL!

Prakriti was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at the age of four. After being asked to leave a mainstream school in Kathmandu Nepal, due to her disability, she was left "feeling hopeless and irritated with life because I was thinking that



I am the only one who is born different." With her mother's persistence, she was admitted to the Self-help Group for Cerebral Palsy programme (SGCP). Prakriti flourished at this school, taking part in many extracurricular activities such as sewing, art and crafts. She had the opportunity to develop her computer skills, including a computer graphics design course. It proved challenging for Prakriti to find a suitable vocation due to her disability. She worked as a receptionist and special needs school teacher. Prakriti was determined to complete her education and obtained her school leaving certificate through a combination of home and schoolbased learning. Whilst working as a teacher in a special needs school, she was nominated for the International Employment Achievement Award through SGCP in 2018, organised by ADAPT in Mumbai. On World Cerebral Palsy Day, Prakriti was honoured to receive the "Individual Employment/Entrepreneurship Award". This was a prestigious accolade for Prakriti, and a very proud moment for her family. In 2020 through SAMA Nepal, she was invited to participate in the Community Initiatives in Inclusion (CII) Course supported by TWC in partnership with ADAPT. This course equipped her with skills in disability and inclusion giving her ideas for implementation in Nepal. Her English language skills improved, as well as her physical and mental wellbeing. Due to the Covid pandemic, Prakriti was unable to return to Nepal, and remained in lockdown at ADAPT's centre. Being away from home during such uncertain times was yet another test of Prakriti's endurance and patience. Under the care and guidance of the team at ADAPT she and other participants kept busy with meditation and other innovative activities. When Prakriti was able to return to Nepal she was even more driven to make a difference. She is now happily working as a computer operator in the Women's Development Branch. Prakriti and her team work to improve awareness in disability and inclusion, inclusive education, and the empowerment of women.

Prakriti has overcome many challenges, however with her determination and passion, supportive family, and guidance from ADAPT and SAMA Nepal she is now working as an ambassador for change.
